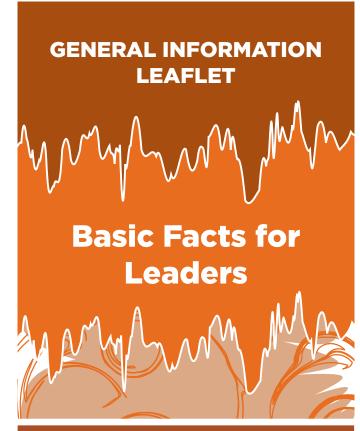

General Features

Recognising a boy who has poor listening skills.

A boy may display the following:

- Easily distracted by background noise and visual factors
- Very fidgety, difficulty sitting still
- Poor eye contact with the person who is speaking to them
- Speaking out of turn
- Difficulty following instructions or responding to questions appropriately
- Disruptive/restless

Useful Strategies

- Reduce background noise
- Slow down
- Repeat instructions
- Use visual prompts
- Ensure task difficulty is appropriate
- Pause regularly between sets of instructions
- Repeat, rephrase, recheck!

REASONS FOR POOR LISTENING SKILLS —

- Adults voice is too fast
- Adults voice is too quiet
- Language being used is:
 - Too long
 - Too complex
- Motivation is low
- Task is too complex or simple
